


Primary Response:



Fire Prevention Bureau



- Only Career fire department in Cape May County enforcing the NJ Uniform Fire Safety Code
- Enables inspections/complaints to be handled 24 hours a day / 7 days a week
- Establishes 18 working Fire inspectors (currently only 16) within the City



Fire Prevention Bureau



- Local Enforcing Agency (LEA) revenue covers:
 - All operating expenses (OE) for Fire Inspections
 - Computer software, servers, etc.
 - 18 (16) Fire Inspectors @ \$ 1500 each
 - Deputy Fire Chief/FO and Secretaries entire salary
 - Fire Department's secretary (22.5%)
 - Penalty money goes directly to Firefighter training and equipment
 - Previously covered Code Enforcement Inspector (33%), Zoning, Code Enforcement and Property Maintenance Offices



Technical Rescue Responses



• Confined Space Rescue

 Rescues in confined spaces, man holes, MUA plants, etc).
 All equipment was donated through American Legion

• Water Rescue

 Open water rescue (beach emergencies). NJSP trained. All members minimum awareness level



- 1979 18 Firefighters
 - EMS coverage 700% call volume increase
- 1999 18 Firefighters
 - Fire Inspections 200% increase in work load
- 2010 16 Firefighters
 - Down 2 Firefighters
- 2001 OE = \$ 65,650
- 2010 OE = \$ 72,200
 - An approximate 1% increase annually

Volunteer Division

- 1979 70 members
 - Waiting list to enter
- 2010 20 "Firefighters"
 - 85% reduction in firefighting membership
 - Stricter training requirements
 - Social Impacts
- 2001 \$ 21,750
- 2010 \$ 11,500
 - 48% reduction over 10 years

Fire at Ken's Bowldrome and Locke's Cigar store - Monday, September 22, 1952 Southeast Corner, Rio Grande and Pacific Avenues, Wildwood, NJ

A fire started with a large explosion that forced out the front of the bowling alley. A loss was set at \$80,000. Local fireman, Charles Bonner suffered a stroke at the fire scene, and died the next day at Burdette Tomlin Memorial Hospital.

 \$2,752,773.00-\$653,900.00 (Ambulance Revenue and Fire Prevention Fees)= \$2,098,773.00

- \$2,098.773.00 divided by the number of properties in Wildwood (5,500)=
 \$381.60 per household
 - Divided by 365 Days per Year=

\$1.05 per day per household

Filling the two vacant firefighter positions would cost \$1.10 per day per household
